<b>FRENCH I</b>	<b>500</b>	Students will comprehend and carry on simple conversations on familiar topics. They will be able to read and understand basic written materials in the present tense. Students will be able to compose short pieces of writing in the present tense on topics of personal interest, and will have exposure to the culture of the native speakers of the target language.

<b>FRENCH II</b>	<b>510</b>	During the second year of study students will build upon the foundation they developed in their first year of study. They will be able to use more advanced vocabulary in conversations and writing activities to express what people did, are doing, and are planning to do. Students will write and perform original skits incorporating the verb tenses and vocabulary presented in their second year of study. They will continue to have exposure to the culture of the native speakers of the target language and continue in the understanding of the differences and similarities between these cultures.

<b>FRENCH III</b>	<b>518</b>	During the third year, students will speak more fluently and their listening comprehension skills will continue to expand and improve as they become involved in the advanced courses. More emphasis will be placed on the ability to express oneself as they write, practice, and present conversation. The student will also develop more skills to read and comprehend the foreign language. Through the use of varied materials they will learn more about the structure of the language, and will gain further knowledge of the customs and characteristics of the countries where the modern language is spoken.
